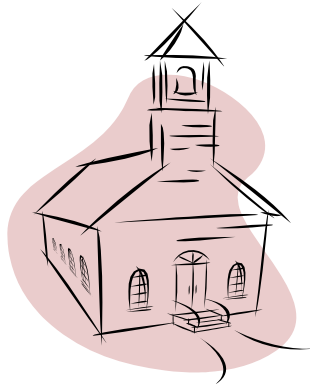

Vote 2012

Starting with the November 2012 General Election, Pennsylvania law now requires voters to show an acceptable photo ID to vote at the polls. All IDs must contain a NAME, a PHOTO, and an EXPIRATION DATE that is CURRENT, unless noted otherwise. Acceptable IDs include:

Photo IDs issued by the U.S. Government or the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

- Pennsylvania driver's license or PennDOT photo ID card (valid for voting 12 months past expiration date)
- U.S. passport
- U.S. military ID (active duty and retired military IDs may designate an expiration date that is indefinite). Military dependents' IDs must contain a current expiration date.
- Employee photo identification issued by Federal, Pennsylvania, or a Pennsylvania County, or Municipal government
- Photo identification issued by an accredited Pennsylvania public or private institution of higher learning
- Photo identification issued by a Pennsylvania care facility

A person who is registered to vote, but does not have an acceptable form of ID, may obtain a FREE PHOTO ID for voting purposes at a PennDOT Driver's License Center.

PennDOT, Police to Partner for Independence Day DUI Enforcement

Harrisburg – State and local police, along with PennDOT, will take part in a national enforcement effort through July 8 targeting motorists who drive under the influence. The "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" enforcement effort will focus on keeping Pennsylvania's roads safe during the Independence Day travel period.

"Many people will celebrate and travel for the Independence Day holiday," PennDOT Secretary Barry J. Schoch said. "Driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs puts your life and the lives of those around you in danger. Designate a driver ahead of time or arrange for a ride home – just don't drive unless you're sober."

Over last year's Independence Day holiday travel period (July 1-4), there were 897 crashes and 14 fatalities. Of those, according to PennDOT, 146 crashes and six fatalities were alcohol-related.

During 2011 there were 11,778 alcohol-related crashes in Pennsylvania, according to PennDOT data, in which 425 people were killed. In 2010, there were 11,682 alcohol-related crashes, according to PennDOT, in which 444 people were killed.

"Motorists must understand that alcohol and driving never mix," said State Police Commissioner Frank Noonan. "Don't get behind the wheel of a vehicle if you've been drinking, even if you plan to only drive a short distance. Enjoy the holiday, but make safety a priority."

The legal blood-alcohol content in Pennsylvania is 0.08 for motorists over the age of 21. For underage drivers, the blood-alcohol limit is 0.02 percent. DUI penalties can include jail time, license suspension and fines of between \$500 and \$5,000.

Pennsylvania's DUI Task Forces, the Pennsylvania State Police and local law enforcement statewide will conduct checkpoints and roving patrols as part of the crackdown. Funding comes from part of PennDOT's statewide distribution of \$4.2 million in federal funds from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Birthrights

Jesus says that unless you become as little children you will not inherit the kingdom of God. Now, keep in mind, he's saying this to grown men. Here he tells us that we must return to the beginning, go back to our roots, and start again. To get back on the road of our divinely intended destiny, we must let go of the debris, clear the clutter and begin again with a clean sheet, seeking the intuitive wisdom of the childlike origination from which we grew.

It seems a difficult task and leaves us asking as adults how a man when he is old can go back to his mother's womb, yet that is precisely what Jesus recommends. To dare to take the risk of living, of loving, of believing, with childlike simplicity of faith, to bring your full self into every present moment, to go from making halfhearted deposits into making the investment of a life worth living. As we let go of the debris, the emotional detritus that has clogged our valves and prevented our functioning at full capacity, we will rediscover ourselves, our best selves and at that point all those around us will reap the reward of the kind of investments that separate challengers from champions.

I will admit that clearing debris is not easy and, like success must be intentional. If you cleave to what you've been through, it remains impossible for those around us to perceive our intentions. Because our intentions do not necessarily emerge through our actions, instead of being subverted by the many defense mechanisms that we've put in place to prevent the possibility of pain. To let go of the past takes great courage, to remove the debris takes great persistence, but if you believe as I do that the reward is worth the effort, then let the work begin.

How do we return as children and start anew? We find compelling wisdom from the prophet Ezekiel, whose words from God for the people of Israel resonate with similar power for us today. He wrote, "On the day you were born your cord was not cut, nor were you washed with water to make you clean, nor were you rubbed with salt or wrapped in cloths. No one looked on you with pity or had compassion enough to do any of these things for you. Rather, you were thrown out into the open field, for on the day you were born you were despised. Then I passed by and saw you kicking about in your blood, and as you lay there in your blood I said to you, 'Live!'"
