## Innovage Recalls Discovery Kids Lamps Due to Fire and Burn Hazards

Importer: Innovage LLC, of Foothill Ranch, Calif.

Hazard: The placement of internal wires near the circuit board can cause electrical short-circuiting and sparking, posing a fire and a burn hazard to consumers.

*Incidents/Injuries*: Innovage has received 11 reports of short circuiting. This includes three reports of lamps catching fire, which led to property damage. No injuries have been reported.

Description: This recall involves Discovery Kids Animated Marine and Safari Lamps that feature rotating films with marine or safari scenes. The words "Discovery Kids" are printed on the front top-left corner of the product. Batch numbers can be found imprinted in the plastic underneath the lamps and on the bottom of the packaging. Model numbers can be found on stickers placed underneath the lamps and on the bottom of the packaging near the barcode.

# Governor Corbett Praises New PennDOT ePermitting Process that Saves Time, Money for Job-Creating Businesses 7/12/2012

Harrisburg – Governor Tom Corbett was joined today by PennDOT Secretary Barry Schoch to showcase how the agency's new ePermitting process for Highway Occupancy Permits (HOPs) is saving time and money for job-creating businesses across the state.

"PennDOT's new ePermitting process is a perfect example of my commitment to make state government more responsive and less bureaucratic," said Governor Corbett. "Highway occupancy permits are now being processed in less than half the time compared to PennDOT's old paper-based system, which means less down time for businesses and faster job creation."

Each year, PennDOT issues approximately 15,000 such permits to businesses, utilities, developers, homeowners and municipalities wanting to complete projects that require access to state roadways. Until last October, permit applications were submitted by hand or mailed to PennDOT offices. Now the process is entirely electronic and applicants can easily check the status of their permit application online.

"Permits that once took 30 to 45 days to review are now being returned to our business partners within an average review time of about 10 days," said PennDOT Secretary Barry Schoch. "Customer response has been overwhelmingly positive and we're proud that the system is helping to deliver a more modern PennDOT."

The new system not only saves time for PennDOT's business partners, but also saves them money by reducing paper, mailing and reproduction costs. Also, the system's transparency allows business partners to communicate directly with the reviewers and anticipate when the permit will be issued.

Governor Corbett has made reforming state government a key priority of his administration. This includes cutting the size and cost of government, ensuring efficient use of taxpayer dollars and re-examining how the state works with employers and business.

"One of the chief goals of my administration has been to cut red tape, to reduce spending and where we can, eliminate waste altogether," Corbett said. "Above all, we look for ways that state government can do things more efficiently."

PennDOT's ePermitting system for Highway Occupancy Permits was recently presented with a regional Best Use of Innovation Award from the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO). Also, Governor Corbett today presented the Governor's Innovator Award to two PennDOT employees, Glenn Rowe, P.E. and Roger Riley for their roles in developing PennDOT's new electronic ePermitting system.

Also offering remarks today was Kevin Johnson, President of Pottstown-Based Traffic Planning and Design.

# Healing the Wounds of the Past TD Jakes

## Infirmed

And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. But when Jesus saw here, He called her to Him and said to her, "Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity". (Luke 13:11-12)

The Holy Spirit periodically lets us catch a glimpse of the personal testimony of one of the patients of the Divine Physician Himself. This woman's dilemma is her own, but perhaps you will find some point of relativity between her case history and your own. She could be like someone you know or have know; she could even be like you.

There are three major characters in this story. These characters are the person, the problem, and the prescription. It is important to remember that for every person, there will be a problem. Even more importantly, for every problem, our God has a prescription!

Jesus' opening statement to the problem is this woman's life is not a recommendation for counseling – it is a challenging command! Often much more is involved in maintaining deliverance than just discussing pas trauma. Jesus did not counsel what should have been commanded. I am not, however, against seeking the counsel of godly people. On the contrary, the Scriptures say:

Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of the sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful (Psalm 1:1)

Where the is no counsel, the people fall; but in the multitude of counselors there is safety (Proverbs 11:14)

What I want to make clear is that after you have analyzed the condition, after you have understood its origin, it will still take the authority of God's Word to put the past under your feet! This woman was suffer as a result of something that had attacked her 18 years earlier.

I wonder if you can relate to the long-range aftereffects of past pain? This kind of trauma is as fresh to the victim today as it was the day it occurred. Although the problem may be rooted in the past, the prescription is a present word from God! The Word is the same yesterday, today, and forevermore (see Heb. 13:8). That is to say, the word you are hearing today is able to heal your yesterday!
