Voice Your Victory

Don't you wonder what David's song must have sounded like in the presence of a king afflicted by evil spirits? If you've ever heard someone play the harp, you know that it can indeed sound like the voice of angels.

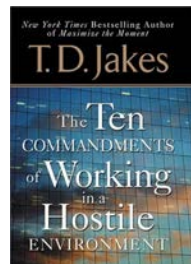
While we might not know exactly what David's song before Saul sounded like, we can glimpse into the young shepherd king's heart by reading his poetry. From the collection of Psalms in the Bible, with the majority written by David, we gain insight into the kind of song that David kept in his heart. Whether in good times or in bad, in prosperity or poverty, in depression or in celebration, we see David turning to God and giving Him thanks and praise. David praises God for what He has done, what He is doing, and what he will do. There are enough verb tenses in the Psalms to keep my old high school English teacher in fits!

When David slays this enemies, he credits God's power for these victories. When David succumbs to his own lustful desires and commits adultery with Bathsheba and then has her husband killed, we see him confess his crimes before God, acknowledging that it's against his Lord that he has sinned. Whether grieving or rejoicing, David knows how to voice the victory he has in God's anointing. Ultimately, it is this confidence in God's goodness and sovereignty that nourish and sustain David throughout his life of tragedy, trama, and triumph. Through it all he remains able to sing the song that God first placed in his heart back on the hillsides outside Bethlehem:

Rejoice in the LORD, O you righteous!
Fro praise from the upright is beautiful.
Praise the LORD with the harp;
Make melody to Him with an instrument of ten strings.
Sing to Him a new song;
Play skillfully with a shout of joy.
For the word of the Lord is right,
And all His work is done in truth.
He loves righteous ness and justice;
The earth is full of the goodness of the LORD.

PennDOT Urges Motorists to Avoid Distractions, Focus on Driving

Harrisburg – As part of National Distracted Driving Awareness Month, PennDOT today urged motorists to drive distraction free, and reminded drivers of the state's law banning text-based communication while driving.

"Driving is a serious job that requires your full attention, all of the time," PennDOT Secretary Barry J. Schoch said. "Distractions come in all forms, and we all need to take personal responsibility for our actions behind the wheel – that includes avoiding distractions."

Distracted driving can include such actions as:

- talking on a cell phone or texting;
- eating;
- grooming;
- adjusting devices such as radios and GPSs;
- attending to children or pets, and
- interacting with other passengers in the vehicle.

While all drivers should avoid distractions; for young, novice drivers, distracted driving can compound the inexperience factor and increase the risk of crash.

Last March, a state law went into effect banning text-based communication while driving. Violating the law is a primary offense carrying a \$50 fine.

According to PennDOT data, more than 14,600 crashes involved a distracted driver in Pennsylvania in 2012, with 57 deaths in those crashes. Over the past five years, nearly 11 percent of Pennsylvania crashes involved a driver distraction, resulting in more than 300 fatalities statewide.

To help avoid distractions while driving, PennDOT recommends that drivers follow these simple safety tips:

- Store or turn off cell phones while driving. If you must make an emergency call, safely pull over to the side of the road.
- If traveling alone, set your GPS, radio and temperature controls before hitting the road.
- If traveling with pets, be sure that they are properly restrained. Better yet, leave them at home. Even a minor crash can result in a major injury to a pet if it is not properly restrained.
- Never operate your vehicle and attend to a child at the same time.
- If you drop an object while driving, leave it until you reach your destination.
