
### Anna's Gift



# *Serve Out of Design, Not Duty*

*“Be honest in your estimate of yourselves.” (Romans 12:3 NLT)*

Most people these days are moving so fast that they don’t have time to listen to their heart any more.

The Bible says that God wants you to listen to your heart. He wants you to look at what you’re made to do, and then you’ll know what he wants you to do. But you’ve got to slow down.

Alabama used to sing this song: “I’m in a hurry to get things done. I rush and rush until life’s no fun. All I really got to do is live and die, but I’m in a hurry and don’t know why. Can’t be late. I leave in plenty of time, shaking hands with the clock. I can’t stop. I’m on a roll, and I’m ready to rock. I hear a voice that says I’m running behind. I better pick up my pace. It’s a race, and there ain’t no room for someone in second place.”

That describes most people today in America. They’re speeding with no direction. But God wants you to slow down and listen to your heart. Romans 12:3 says, “*Be honest in your estimate of yourselves*” (NLT). *What I suggest you do is get alone with God and ask these questions: “What do I love to do? What do I dream of doing? What fascinates me? What can I talk about, think about, and study all day and not get bored? Where have I been most effective in my life?”*

I once baptized an 80-year-old woman after a service at Saddleback Church. She wanted to be a small group host. That’s pretty cool — an 80-year-old small group host! She said, “I just wish I learned years ago that we serve God out of our design, not out of duty.”

I wish everybody could learn that truth. That’s what SHAPE — your spiritual gifts, *heart*, *abilities*, *personality*, and *experiences* — is all about. We serve God out of our design and the way he shaped us. We serve God not out of duty but because we love him. Because when you do what he wired you to do, it brings glory to him.

That’s the way to live. Don’t serve God out of force or design or guilt. Serve him out of delight and gratitude. Make a careful exploration of who you are and the work you’ve been given — in other words, what God put you on Earth to do.

## ***Be a Make-It-Happen Person***

*You dream about something.* You have faith in God. Now put a strategy in place to make those dreams happen. Take them out of your head and make concrete, small steps toward them.


We may see other people achieve the kinds of things we wish we could—buying homes, starting businesses, enjoying relationships—and get upset, thinking, *They aren't as smart or as capable as we are. How could they achieve where we haven't?* we wonder. What we don't know is that those people had a plan. We work hard like they had to work hard, but they worked smart: they worked according to a plan. We never see what they sacrificed for the things they've achieved. From the outside, people's accomplishments may look as if they were simple to achieve, but from the inside out, the situation is very likely different.

Do some homework, put together a plan, and ready yourself for success. For example, buying a house was important to me. My parents taught me that home ownership was one of the roads to wealth. When I bought my first home, I had a strategy. My credit wasn't great and my resources were limited. I had to make a plan and implement it. I started developing relationships with people at my local bank. I worked to reduce my debt, sacrificing and saving every way I could. I did everything possible to put myself in line with the move I wanted to make next. Eventually it happened; I bought my first home.

Have you ever been watching television or reading a newspaper or magazine and seen a program or an ad for a product and exclaimed to yourself, "That was my idea!" Ideas only become a reality when we take the steps to get them out of our head and into the real world. ...

# Philips Lighting Recalls Endura and Ambient LED Bulbs Due to Shock Hazard

**Name of product.** Endura and Ambient LED dimmable light bulbs

**Hazard.** A lead wire in the bulb's housing can have an improper fitting, which can electrify the entire lamp and pose a shock hazard.

**Consumer Contact.** Philips Lighting Co. at (800) 295-5147 between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. ET Monday through Friday, online at [www.recall.philips.com](http://www.recall.philips.com), choose United States/English and click on the Endura and Ambient LED bulb recall for more information or email the firm at [ledprincelamp@philips.com](mailto:ledprincelamp@philips.com) for more information.

**Description.** This recall involves Endura 12-watt and Ambient 12.5-watt LED dimmable light bulbs. The bulbs are orange in color and have "MADE IN CHINA," "Fabrique in Chine" followed by a slanted "S," and the model number 9290001829 printed on the gray plastic band on the neck of the bulbs. The date codes, 2L for the Endura bulbs and 2K or 2L for the Ambient bulbs, are printed on the metal screw base. The bulbs give off a white light and are used indoors to replace incandescent bulbs. The following chart outlines the recall details:

**Remedy.** Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled LED bulbs, unplug the fixture, remove the bulb and contact Philips for free replacement bulbs.

**Sold at.** Home Depot, grocery and home center stores nationwide, online retailers, including Amazon.com and through electrical distributors between October 2012 and May 2013 for between \$15 and \$30.
