Her simple request that we "pray for her strength in the Lord" then "Mom" would open her mouth to sing and a sound would emerge that was so bold that it made you take notice. It made me sit up, and I tell you the truth and lie not, I got goose bumps when she uttered the first lines "I've had some good days...". One might say that the sound was bold and almost arrogant, but it was not arrogance, it was confidence. Mom

> knew of whom she sang. "...l've had some hills to climb..." it was so believable and you knew that she was not just singing from words printed on a page or from memory of a record or tape cassette, but from a real life relationship with her Savior.

TURN ON HEAD-**LIGHTS WHEN US-ING WIPERS** 12/01/2006

HARRISBURG - The Department of Transportation announced today that a new law, which

goes into effect in January, will require motorists to turn on their headlights anytime their vehicles wipers are in continuous or intermittent use due to weather or other atmospheric conditions such as fog or mist.

Motorists who do not comply with the law could face a fine of \$25, but with fees and other associated costs, the penalty would approach \$100.

New Law Imposes Heavy Fines for Incidents Causing Injury or Death

HARRISBURG - The Department of Transportation is reminding motorists that under a new state law, they will face severe fines if snow or ice that falls from their vehicle causes injury or



death to other motorists or pedestrians.

"We've urged motorists to remove all ice and snow from their vehicles

before traveling for years. Not only for their own safety, but for the safety of all motorists," said PennDOT Secretary Allen D. Biehler, P.E. "We

hope motorists will take this advice all

the more seriously now that the new law is in place."

Enacted in May, Act 37 states that when snow or ice is dislodged



or falls from a moving vehicle and strikes another vehicle or pedestrian causing death or serious bodily injury, the operator of the vehicle from which the snow or ice came is subject to a fine of \$200 to \$1,000 for each offense.

For Your Health—Is It a Cold or the Flu?

The cold and the flu are both respiratory illnesses, but they are caused by different types of viruses. Flu symptoms usually come on quickly (within 3-6 hours) and the symptoms can be mild to severe without much notice. Be aware of your body.

Cold symptoms are less severe and the symptoms usually begin in 2-3 days, during this time you are contagious, though the symptoms may take a week to fully develop. There are over 200 viruses that may cause a cold, but generally after 7-10 days you are usually not contagious and you should begin to feel better.
