Bishop Bartley began first by giving a Word to Pastor Avery that God works in seasons and that seven is God's perfect number. Pastor has 14 years of service, which is two seasons of completion. Bishop Bartley told Pastor Avery that God will do his work through the Holy Spirit in his next season. He said "Get ready, get ready, get ready and stir it up."

He proceeded to talk about the process of Impartation. He told us the anointing we have now isn't all we will possess. We need folk in our lives to see what we don't see. The Kingdom is a voice activated system that releases things when you speak them out of your mouth. We need to guard our mouths and what we speak. Impartation means to pass on something from one to another from us. This gift needs to be received by somebody or it's not a gift. We have gifts locked up in us. The anointing comes

other reactions that they might not have expected. We have many teachers, but we need to be fed at church. What

when we are minding our business. Church folk

you feed will follow you. We need someone to pour into our lives the anointing that they have to pass on and that person needs to know the process of release.

Bishop Bartley continued to speak on Blind Faith: where He leads you'll follow. The Bishop talked about the place of "Bethel," which means the House of God where all things start.

In this place God will break your will so He can use you. He'll place you among people and then remove you from them. This allows you to recognize the purpose of the anointing in your life, but you must stay connected to the Holy Spirit. Then he talked of being in "Jericho" which releases a fragrance

so you can go and discover yourself. Then you have "Jordan" which is the River of Death that place where we all must go. Here you will be separated from the present and taken to the place God is trying to take you. Some things will have to die in your flesh and in your will before you can go on to the next level. It can cost you everything to get into God's Will. People who knew you in your BC, now won't recognize you in your AC life.

what is necessary to get to the next level.

People can't get caught up in titles and follow from afar, not knowing God's Will for themselves. When God moves corporately, we need to make our requests know, while the waters are troubled and not when we leave and go home. Timing is everything. We need to know when to jump into the stirred waters and when to get out of them. Sometimes people aren't clear on their needs. We need to have a talk with Jesus and tell him all about them even though he knows before we make our request to him. Trouble is always around.

Mother's Day - Do Celebrate!

The earliest Mother's Day celebrations can be traced back to spring celebrations of ancient Greece. In the 1600's, England celebrated "Mothering Sunday," honoring the mothers of England. As Christianity spread throughout Europe the celebration changed to include honoring the "Mother Church" the spiritual power that gave them life and protected them from harm. In the United States in 1872, Julia Ward Howe, who wrote "The Battle Hymn of the Republic," first suggested an annual Mother's Day celebration dedicated to peace. Anna Jarvis, of Philadelphia, PA, was inspired by her mother's wishes for a day to be set aside for Mothers. After her mother's death in 1905, Anna began to work, diligently lobbying for the day. She succeeded when, in 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a resolution designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

This year in the U.S. and many other countries around the world, Mother's Day is being celebrated on May 13th. Mother; Mother is a very special word. To different people it conjures up dif-

ferent meanings, images and, emotions. In looking it up there were 15 various definitions. As a young teenager, I had several women in my life who I called "Mom," besides my own mother whom I idolized and adored. These were mothers of close friends and they were my mom when I was away from home. Calling them "Mom" allowed me to feel accepted, cared for, and even special. But what I will do is reminisce. I will think about her smile and the gentle-

ness of her hands. I cringe and laugh as I recollect her times I required "discipline." Flora didn't play. Getting your own switch from the hedges outside was just one of her techniques. (Come on now, your Mom did it too if you're honest and of my generation.) will think about all the things she taught me and my 9 siblings. While having some regret over lost moments, I will remember the times, as a young adult, I thought she had just lost her mind. Finally I understood she was my mother; a woman, as fallible as any other, but who loved me as she knew how and gave me what she believed I needed. I beam remembering the conversations we shared as best friends. I often thank her silently for the values, the morals, the life lessons she taught us; her sacrifices, strength, blood, sweat and tears, and what it allowed her to instill in us. They will also have to identify ways that the Good Shepherd has shown His love to him or her individually. The Sunday school teacher will assist them in seeing ways that Jesus takes care of them. With each class the children will be asked to thank Jesus for the Sunday school class and the opportunity it gives them to learn more about Him and to give thanks to Jesus for the new day He has given them.







Solid Approaches to Men's Ministry



Choose activities and environments that strike a chord with guys. Job 4:3

Men's needs are the same everywhere. They

want an honest place where there is no spiritual, relational, or vocational pretense. Men want a place of acceptance where they can talk about anything and everything. Once a leader decides ministering to men is his priority, he should consider the following tools to effectively reach out to men.

1. Recreation time. Walks, tennis, vacations, electronic games, fishing, movies, and table tennis free men for brotherly relationships. When we are free of tasks, we are better able to grow comfortable together, laugh with one another, and discover each person's uniqueness.

2. The working world. Leaders usually see men only in church, where we are

in control. We would, however, learn more about men by seeing them at their job sites. Only when we see them in their environments do we discover their areas of expertise as well as discouragement. The men are impressed that we care to invest the time during the week, and we become much closer.

3. Being specific. Men want to know how a thing works, not a litany of sales promotions. Whether it is a new car, a job, or a relationship, men want practical helps. Consequently, I share the how-to's of relying on Christ, resisting the Devil, counseling, discipling, and other ministries. Each man immediately applies the teachings to his life. Supportive accountability is provided for his expressed goals, which he alone establishes. Men respond well in an environment where all the brothers are applying the Word specifically rather than hiding behind abstract propositional truths.

I am convinced that men want a gospel with teeth, but not one that bites. They want to be stretched, yet they need an environment of grace, liberation, and Christ's authentic power. By challenging them to be honest and equipping them for ministry, they are becoming responsible leaders and witnesses in their homes and jobs. The results are thrilling: they are becoming deacons, teachers, disciplers, evangelists, elders, small-group leaders, worship leaders, and ministry coordinators.

PennDOT Notifying Drivers of Federal Change That Could Affect Driving

4/19/2007-General

HARRISBURG - The Department of



Transportation is notifying drivers who have outstanding violations in other states about a federallymandated change that could affect

their Pennsylvania driving privileges.

The federal Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act requires all drivers to reconcile any outstanding driver sanctions in other states before obtaining a driver's license or learner's permit.

"This federal mandate is designed to make sure drivers are held accountable for their unsafe driving practices by preventing them from hiding sanctions by moving from state to state," PennDOT Secretary Allen D. Biehler, P.E., said.

In compliance with this provision, Penn-DOT is now required to check the National Driver Register's Problem Driver Pointer System for individuals whose driving privileges have been sanctioned in other states. Pennsylvania cannot issue, renew or replace a driver's license until the sanctions have been resolved.

Approximately 170,000 of Pennsylvania's 8.5 million licensed drivers are expected to be affected by this additional provision of the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act. To give Pennsylvania drivers with out-of-state driver sanctions advance notice, PennDOT is conducting courtesy checks both six months and three months prior to the expiration of the individual's driver's license. If a sanction exists, PennDOT will notify the individual by mail with the name and contact information of the state in which the sanction is present.

"We urge all Pennsylvania drivers with outstanding driver sanctions in other states to immediately reconcile those sanctions so that their driving privilege is not affected," Biehler said.




<u>Please pass along.....this is an excellent job opportunity.</u>

The Federal Aviation Association is taking applications for air traffic controller school. We all have kids and know kids in the right age group (under 31) and with some effort they could reach a salary of over \$100,000 with benefits in about 3 years. You need only a high school diploma to apply and credit is given for college on the exam.

They need to go to FAA.gov (http://www.faa.gov/jobs/job_opportunities/airtraffic_controllers/) for details and to fill out the application immediately - even if they don't know if they'd want to attend immediately - it's the federal government and it may take them months to call. The key is to apply NOW. There will be a lot of retirements coming up rather quickly and they need to line up training to accommodate these openings. It's my understanding that the FAA rarely has an open application such as this and that the jobs are coveted. My friends daughter is 28 years old and is well into 3 figures and has plenty of time for travel/recreation and has started another career on the side.

This is a great opportunity and it should be noted that choosing a site like Anchorage or Indianapolis to train is a likely acceptance into the training program - after-which you can transfer anywhere in the country that has a tower.





Telephone Scams - Don't Become a Victim



Telephone scams always sound a little unbelievable-until they happen to you. Con artists are very persuasive and most people naturally let their

guard down in the privacy of

their own home, expecting a friend or relative to be on the phone, not a criminal. You may not think that there is anything anyone could say to convince you to give away personal information or credit card numbers, but it happened every day. Telephone scammers all have the same motive: to get your money or enough personal information to steal your identity.

Avoid Becoming a Victim:

Never give personal information including credit card numbers, your social security number, or birth date over the phone unless you initiated the call.

If you are not interested in or feel uneasy about the call, hang up!

If you do not want to make a purchase, ask for a catalog or other information to be sent to you by mail.

Never allow yourself to be pushed into a hurried decision. If an offer sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

Check out unsolicited offers with the Better Business Bureau, your local consumer protection agency, or the Attorney General's office before sending money.

Types of Telephone Scams and Telemarketing Fraud:

Jury Duty: The caller claims to work for the local court and says that you've failed to report for jury and a warrant is being issued for your arrest. When you claim you never received a notice to report to jury duty, the caller asks for your social security number and birth date and possibly even a credit card number to verify your identity to stop the warrant.

Charitable Giving: Requests for donations to help fund research to save children with cancer or feed war refugees may pull at your heart strings but should not make us open up our wallets. Highly emotional pleas are designed to evoke feelings guilt that would make us send money or give credit card numbers to an unknown source. Instead, ask the caller to send you information by mail and investigate the charity before making a donation.

Free Gifts, Prizes or Vacations: If the offer is truly free, then the caller shouldn't need your credit card number. Do not give it to cover shipping, or holding or registration of gifts, prizes or vacations.

Unsolicited Offers: Offers for investments, unbeatable deals, and special savings just for you all sound enticing. But unsolicited offers are often combined with high pressure sales tactics and one time only opportunities that will result in you getting nothing for you money.


