### Sanctification

What does "sanctification" mean to you? Pastor Avery asked this question during our bible study class. At that time and moment, nobody in the class could answer that question. Even though many Saints today will tell you that they are saved and sanctified; they are unable to give you an explanation of what that truly means. After Pastor Avery asked the question, I went home and did some studying on it. God gave me the answer to the guestion. I would like to share that with you.

Sanctification: the separation of the believer from evil things and ways.

Scripture references: 1 Thessalonians 4:1-12; Romans 6:19-23.

Sanctification is that relationship with God into which men enter by faith in Christ (Acts 26:16-18). Also to which their sole title is the death of Christ (Colossians 1:19-22, Hebrews 13:8-9 & 12). Sanctification is God's will for the believer, and His purpose in calling us by the gospel that must be learned from God, as He teaches it by His Word (John 17:15-19). It must be pursued by the believer earnestly and undeviatingly (Hebrews 12:12-15). The holy character cannot be transferred or imputed, it is an individual possession built up little by little as the result of obedience to the word of God. Also by following the example of Christ (Matthew 11:29, Philemon 2:5-8) and in the power of the Holy Spirit (Romans 8:9-13, Ephesians 3:16-17).

Sanctification is also the state predetermined by God for believers into which, in grace, He calls us and in and we then begin our Christian

Course and so pursue it. Hence we are called "Saints".

This sainthood is not an attainment, it is a state into which God, in grace, calls men, yet believers, to be set apart or to sanctify themselves through cleansing themselves from all defilement. Forsaking sin, living a "holy" manner of life, and experiencing fellowship with God in His holiness (1 Peter 1:13-17).

I hope that what you have just read gives you an increased understanding of the significance of living a life of sanctification and holiness.

inside of us is not right. There is a pain that shoots through the church when a member has suffered. There are some of us who, when we get wounded, place ourselves on our own cross for a pity party simply because we like the attention. However, these are things that God has prescribed for you. He says He is coming back. He is telling you that He gave you something; He has equipped you for this period in your life. When our flesh is tempted we get into trouble, so God knew He had to appeal to the spirit

man. God knew you were going to "act up" over 2,000 years ago and took wounds for us. He does all the fighting and we walk away with the victory! Imagine: God and Satan in the ring fighting over

your soul and you get the Heavy Weight Title. Defeat is Not an Option.

Elder Parchia went on to say that as we entered in to Pentecost, we needed to examine the things that have happened; 120 people sitting in the Upper Room praying, expecting, and demonstrating faith. He told them He must leave so that the Comforter may come. They were instructed to go and wait, "Stay put so you can receive." Stay in the spirit world. People like being in the presence of God. As we go from Resurrection

Day to Pentecost there is a communion in which we must walk. Challenge yourself asking why you are in the position of sitting in Gods house. There is a prophetic movement of God moving through the

kingdom. We are all here for a reason. We are not to be defeated, but to receive His Holy Spirit in order that we present it back to our Savior.

As Pentecost comes we need to prepare ourselves for the wind in our house, so that the wind of God gets to the people of God. There is a knowledge you must have in your spirit so even when you don't see Him, even when you don't feel Him, you know He is there. God is shifting, Elder Parchia shared, to prepare us for the weight of Glory, God sees us and still uses us. He looks beyond our faults and saw our needs. Elder Parchia used this analogy; a jeweler uses a magnifier to view precious gems allowing them to see what the naked eye can not see. God magnifies our lives and He sees what areas in our lives we have been a Judas. He looks into our future, magnifies Himself in us and puts His power in us.

Then we were blessed, yet again, to have a first time speaker to Greater Works Ministries from Richmond, VA. Pas-





the movie theater but are an hour late for church. You have to know who you are in Jesus. Samson lost his identity. We don't realize that folks are laughing at us. Don Imus was called on the carpet and fired. But what about the inside jobs? The likes of Snoop Doggy Dog are turning our men into gangsters and our women in to anything but ladies. Speak and BET - inside jobs. The inside jobs hurt more. You know your enemies and what they will do. Your friends know you and you thought you could trust them. 
work makes a dream work and dream work makes a team

## Dads, Make Some Memories - Father's Day 2007

In May I did a little research on Mother's Day, so it is only natural that I would do the same for Fathers. After all, technically, you can not have one without the other. Father's Day was born from an idea that came to Sonora Smart Dodd one Sunday morning in 1909, while she was in church listening to a Mother' Day sermon. (See what I mean about not having one without the other?) Sonora was 16 years old when her mother passed away while giving birth to her sixth child. Her father was left to raise her, the only girl, and her brothers. Sonora wanted her father to know how special he was and because her father was born in June, she chose that month for its celebration. In 1924 President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. In 1926, a National Father's Day Committee was formed and in 1956 it was recognized by a Joint Resolution of Con-

gress. It was President Richard Nixon who established a permanent national observance in 1972 only 35 years ago. The flower for Father's Day is a rose: red for a living father and white if he has passed on.

Fathers are a different breed than mothers. But boy or girl, we need our fathers in our homes now more than ever. Particularly in African American homes, our children need positive male role models. Men that are willing and able to handle the responsibilities associated with fatherhood as well as being a husband. Mom is often the biggest teacher, but dad can have some powerful lessons to share as well. I have fond recollections of my dad. His father passed when he was but 5 years old. He was raised by a strong black woman, and I would venture to guess that joining the military played a big part in his development. My oldest son once told me, "The military will teach you everything you need to know about being a man if you didn't get it at home or something's wrong with you."

My father, in my eyes, had to be the most physically powerful man in the world and also the tallest, (or so it

seemed given he was only 5'8" tall.) That was how he carried himself; tall, and that was how he taught us to carry ourselves; with pride. He was big on education. If he was still alive he would be about 93 years old. A survivor of the Deep South, he graduated from high school through sheer perseverance; and later in life even with a wife and ten children at home, he decided to pursue

his education taking night classes at La-Salle University. He began teaching my twin brother and me, basic math and reading before we entered school. He was a man of few words, unless you were unfortunate enough to get one of his infamous unwanted lectures. These seemed to go on for an eternity. If you mustered up the nerve to ask to go to a party with friends, for the next hour you were lectured about the pitfalls of being with the wrong crowd. I have often told people that the worse beating I ever had in my life (Yes, I said beating. That's what it was called) was from my father, and he never touched me! I say it was the worse, simply because this giant went through the motions of threatening to hit me. I screamed and danced like my feet were on fire. But there was also the fun stuff. He would salsa around the coffee table and then dance with me standing on his feet. Sometimes he would join us in our weekly Friday night Beatles party. I remember the rush I would get when I looked up from the sidewalk at school to see his car there when it had rained and we had no umbrellas for the walk home. When my mother was ill, and the girls needed their hair done, that man could do a press and curl of champions! And cook? He could dance circles

around my Mom with some of his meals. He did grocery shopping and laundry. All this from a man who would proudly explain the roles of men versus

those of women; a male chauvinist to the 10th degree, but he was a father first. You didn't get a lot of hugs and kisses,

but you did know you were loved. I remember the trip to down town Philadelphia to John Wanamaker's, all dressed up, just me and my dad, to get my 17year old birthday present. I'll never forget it. My relationship with my dad grew to be very special. As a young tyke, I once kicked my mother for kissing him one afternoon. He gave the best "men advice" of anyone I know, and I knew I

could trust his answers.

My dad certainly set some wonderful examples. Children learn what they live. He never missed a day of work. He taught my 6 brothers how to take their place in the world as men, showing them what they may have to do to care for their families. He worked two jobs when he had to. I have never seen my brothers idle. They all do house work and change diapers, some better at it than others. Never have I known their families to suffer hardships. They all finished school and all went on to further their education in one way or another. My father showed his sons what a father is and his daughters what a husband should be. It was because of my dad that we never missed a Sunday at church. I often wonder if I honored him as much as he deserved. Dads and want to be dads, remember it is a commitment 365 days a year for the rest of your lives. It is sacrifice. It is joy. If you don't have children of your own, maybe you can be a big brother or a mentor to someone whose father is absent. Even if you have children you can still mentor someone else's. The rewards can be awesome! Children, respect and obey your fathers. Honor

them. Dads, create some memories from love and you will always have each other.






