"Work Place Violence"

What is Workplace Violence?

Workplace Violence covers not only physical violence, but also includes outbursts such as threats, harassment, abuse, and intimidation. These verbal forms of violence often signal more serious violence to come.

Warning signs of violence

- Direct or veiled threats of harm.
- Intimidating, belligerent, harassing, bullying, or other inappropriate and aggressive behavior.
- Numerous conflicts with supervisors and employees.
- Bringing a weapon to the workplace or making references to guns
- Statements indicating desperation over family, financial or other problems

Coping with Threats and Violence

For an angry or hostile customer or coworker

- Stay calm and listen attentively
- Maintain eye contact
- Be courteous and patient
- Keep the situation in control

For a person shouting, swearing, and threatening

- Signal a coworker tat you need help
- Do not make any calls

For someone threatening you with a weapon

- Stay calm and quietly for help
- Maintain eye content
- Stall for time. Keep talking but follow the person's instructions
- Don't risk harm to yourself or others
- Never try to grab the weapon
- Watch for a safe chance to escape



Goals

- Your goal is to help defuse the person's anger so that the person can cool down to the point of talking
- Try to signal for help, management, police or paramedics
- If you observe unusual behavior in others, talk to your supervisor

The Inevitable Appointment

Usually on Tuesday evenings the saints of Greater Work Ministries gather for Discipleship Training. However, anyone who has come in contact with Pastor C Mark Avery learns that he believes that the saints need a well rounded education. On June 26, 2007 the saints, along with Pastor Avery were blessed to a mini-seminar on funeral preparation. Lillian DeBaptiste, F.D. of DeBaptiste Funeral Home, Inc. in West Chester, Pennsylvania, presented the saints with an informative and necessary session on a topic from which many of us tend to shy away. DeBaptiste Funeral Home, Inc. was started in 1954 by Dr. Clifford and Inez DeBaptiste. In 1964 they constructed their first funeral home, or in other words, it was not a pre-constructed house converted into a funeral home. Lillian DeBaptiste, F.D., the daughter of Clifford and Inez, spoke to the saints with over 30 years of knowledge and experience. She spoke to us about the cultural differences that are encountered when a loved passes, addressing how African –Americans in many ways appear to be better equipped in the mourning process as it is inherent in our cultural response.

A funeral symbolizes "grief gone public." You

are able to stop, reflect, and come together with others. The body of the deceased is a powerful symbol. It is important because it allows the survivors to come face to face with the new reality (of loss). The funeral allows you to celebrate the life of the deceased. Through questions and answers, Ms. DeBaptiste explained that funeral preparation is becoming more common place. It is a way of easing the burden on your self. If you plan your funeral and make certain things are in order, you can focus on other areas of your life and be sure you'll be buried in that favorite outfit. Another benefit is easing the burden for your family during this time of stress and intense grief, leaving them with fewer decisions to make. They will simply need to refer to your documented wishes. There are several types of funerals. The goal of the DeBaptiste Funeral Home is to serve the family and assist them in having a service that not only meets the needs and desires of the grieving but also honors the deceased loved one, while keeping it within the financial means of the family. Funerals are sometimes more of a reunion than a family reunion or a wedding. Cremation is also an option, but it does not mean that a viewing can not be held. Cremation services today can give more flexibility and are far different than in years past. The choices available for the remains of a deceased vary from urns that look like boots, statues, art work, and paper weights to jewelry including man made diamonds!

Ms DeBaptiste, additionally informed the saints about prepaid funeral services which can actually save you money. This is done through an insurance plan that can be automatically debited from a bank account if you chose over a set period of time, generally about three years but can be up to ten. This can also ease a tremendous burden on you and family knowing that finances will not add to the stress of those left behind. We all need to remember that everyone travels this journey differently. You will not be in the same place as a spouse, a child, or a sibling. The saints were given packets with additional useful information leaving with increased understanding. Dying is apart of living. 
What a blessing to just have some good ole, up front, tell it like it is, down to earth preaching!

propane burners, two huge fans, the cables and last but not least, the balloon. The pilot connected the balloon to the basket with huge cables, and set up the two huge fans. The fans were turned on and as my father and another passenger held the mouth of the balloon open it began to fill with cool

air, as the other crew members made sure that every inch of the balloon received the air. Once the balloon was 90% inflated, the basket was up righted and the pilot turned on the propane burners to fill the remainder of the balloon with hot air. It was really amazing to see the dif-

ferent stages the balloon went through

to become the beautiful spectacle we see floating through the air.


