Stay Informed - First Responders Look for ICE

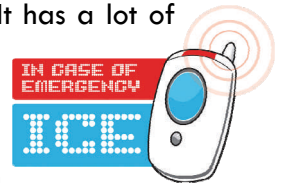
In this instance, ICE has nothing to do with the soon-to-be-expected winter conditions. ICE stands for In Case of Emergency.

A few years ago, a British paramedic first promoted the concept of ICE - storing emergency contact numbers in cell phones under the

heading of ICE, should the cell phone owner ever be in an emergency situation.

The concept has now crossed the Atlantic and Chester County's first responders are taking advantage of it. The ICE contact helps first responders learn if a patient has any medical conditions or allergies. It also helps them inform family mem-

bers if the patient will be taken to a nearby hospital or flown to a regional facility. It has a lot of value, and doesn't cost a penny.



Make sure you include an ICE listing in your cell phone contact list—and tell your family and friends as well.

Stay Informed - Jury Scam

This has been verified by the FBI (their link is included below). This scam is REAL, and it is spreading fast. Jury scams have been around for years, but have seen resurgence in recent months.

The scam preys upon anyone who is inclined to take a jury summons seriously -- as most of us do.

The caller will claim to be a jury coordinator, inquiring about your failure to respond to a jury summons. If you protest that you never received a summons for jury duty,

the scammer will ask you for your Social Security number and your date of birth so he or she can verify their information in order to "cancel an arrest warrant."

Make no mistake about it: this is an identity theft scam. The fraud has been reported so far in 11 states, including Pennsylvania. It is particularly insidious because they use intimidation over the phone by pretending they are with the court system.

The FBI and the federal court system have both issued nationwide alerts on their web sites, warning

Note: Jury officials will rarely call. If they do call, it will be after you have sent back your jury questionnaire. Jury officials will **NEVER** ask for personal information such as bank account, social security, or credit card numbers. **Do not** give this information to the caller.

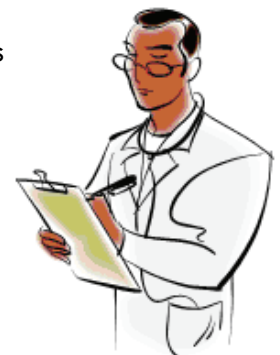
Even with all the high tech tests, medications, and procedures that are available today, an accurate family health history remains one of the most important tools in keeping yourself healthy. Since most diseases have both environmental and genetic components, your family's health history can provide a road map to your strengths and weaknesses, which can help you recog-

nize, and even fend off, inheritable illnesses in their early stages.

Tracking Your History

To collect your family's history you will need some basic medical facts about your parents, siblings, grandparents and aunts and uncles and even first cousins. Talk with them and get the specific ages when family members developed health problems like heart disease, stroke, cancer, diabetes, Alzheimer's, osteoporosis, asthma,

blindness, deafness, depression, alcoholism and more. If family member are diseased, find out when and how they died. Some relatives may not want to share or some may not know but whatever you learn will be helpful.



THE SAFEST PLACE

How to stay safe in the world today.

1. Avoid riding in automobiles because they are responsible for 20% of all fatal accidents.
2. Do not stay home because 17% of all accidents occur in the home.
3. Avoid walking on streets or sidewalks because 14% of all accidents occur to pedestrians.
4. Avoid traveling by air, rail, or water because 16% of all accidents involve these forms of transportation.
5. Of the remaining 33%, 32% of all deaths occur in Hospitals. So, ... above all else, avoid hospitals.

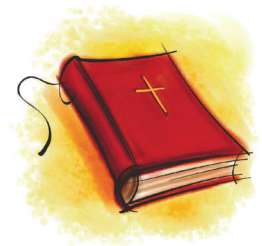

The Urban Institute Summer Academy for Public Policy Analysis and Research will provide a unique learning experience for **minority college students** who are interested in careers in public policy research.

While minorities and persons from distressed communities are often the subject of social programs and policies, they are greatly under-

represented in the field of public policy research. Adding the voices and perspectives of researchers from diverse backgrounds will make a valuable contribution to the field.

Our eight-week summer program will give students between their junior and senior year of college extensive exposure to policy research institutions and help them develop the technical skills that are crucial to obtaining highly competitive entry positions in the field. Students will also gain knowledge about public policies, particularly those affecting low and moderate income families and communities, while developing their analytical and career skills.

Training will take place at the Urban Institute in Washington, D.C., from June 8 through August

2, 2008. **Student travel and living expenses will be covered, plus a stipend will be provided.**

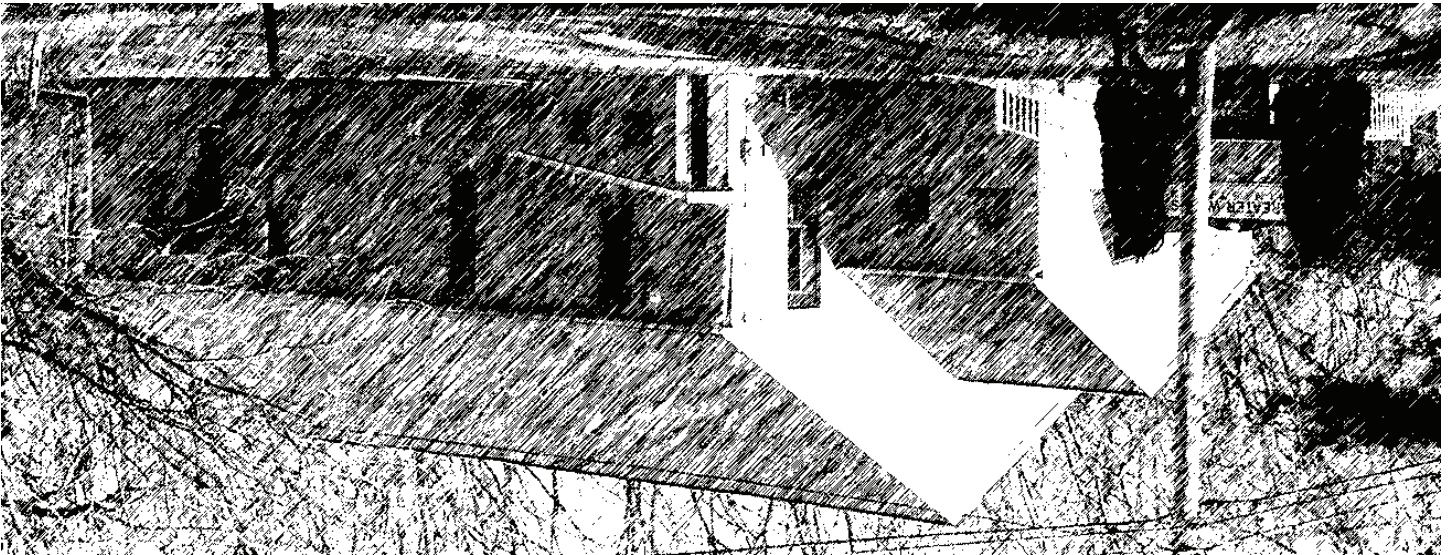
